- f. 1-2 Correspondence, 1837-1893. Mostly family letters, to and from John L. McCraw, Greene County, Missouri, his relatives, and friends. Letters from John L. McCraw, Jr. while in the Union army, 1863-1865, to his sister.
One from G.W. Etter, describing poverty of people in Tennessee after the war. Letters from relatives in Roane County, Tennessee, and one from F.F. Steel, from Yuba City, California to his sister.
- f. 3-4 Documents, 1824-1882. Grants of land in Tennessee, 1824-1825, to Nathan Turner. Letter of administration of estate of Nathan Turner, 1840. Oath of allegiance to U. S. Government, 1862. Enrollment of D.E.W. Turner, 1864, as militiaman. Appointment of John L. McCraw as supervisor of registration for Greene Co., Mo., 1866. Petitions, survey of land, etc.
- f. 5 Miscellaneous Papers, 1867-1919. These include notices of road petitions, funeral notice of N.B. Turner, Republican ticket (1865) and Radical ticket, land surveys; abstract of sale of real estate, list of county warrants, and other items.
- f. 6 Receipts, 1843-1878. Tax receipts of John L. McCraw, D.E.W. Turner for land in Greene County, Missouri, and miscellaneous receipts.
- f. 7 Verse, 1861-1864. Compositions and verse, and a copybook belonging to John L. McCraw, 1861.

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
