Records of a mercantile firm in Fulton, Missouri. Business, the Civil War, state insane asylum, and politics are discussed. Records of the Tucker and Harris mercantile firm, later the D.M. and J.H. Tucker firm.

Rhodus and Bryan, Benton, and Bell, two firms of commission merchants of St. Louis. Tuckers' subscription to state lunatic asylum. Accounts with Tucker firm for dry goods, ready-made clothing, hardware, notions, and groceries.
- f. 28 Bills of Lading, 1851-1876. Accounts of merchandise shipped by boat or train for the Tuckers.
- f. 29-34 Promissory Notes, Checks, Due Bills, Receipts, 1844-1901
- f. 35 Orders for Money and Merchandise, 1844-1888. Orders on the Tuckers for money to be paid and merchandise to be charged.

- f. 36-37 Account Books, 1870-1890. Two books containing miscellaneous accounts and memoranda of expenses, 1870-1872; one book containing daily accounts of money received and expended, 1882-1884; two books containing memoranda of purchases to be made, 1885-1890.
