### **INTRODUCTION**

The papers contain one letter to Emma S. Ringo, of Mexico, Missouri, from Lexington, Virginia, June 23, 1866. In answer to question, "What point in the South would a few thousand dollars do the most good?" Lee said the southern cities were in greater distress, and to contact Mrs. Benjamin Howard, president of Southern Aid Society.
