#### INTRODUCTION

Letters of a Union soldier in Missouri to his family in Newark, Missouri. Also letters telling of his death in Ironton, Missouri, of improper vaccination.

#### DONOR INFORMATION

The papers were donated to the University of Missouri by Mrs. V.L. Outwater on 22 February 1944 (Accession No. 94).

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection contains twenty-four letters of a Union soldier during Civil War written from Northeast Missouri to his family in Newark, Missouri, 1861-1863, as well as three letters concerning Wesley's illness and death due to improper vaccination from Ironton, Missouri, 1863.

The following letters are also included: Emeline Kaylor to her daughter on her way to school, 1857; William Sipple, Forbestown, California, to Kaylor about 1861 election; Kaylor to "Dear Sir" about the gold fields, 1862; and sister to Kaylor about local affairs, 1863.
