## INTRODUCTION

Irene B. Taeuber, a research demographer, was best known for her work on the population of Asia, especially Japan and China. Collection includes correspondence with leading demographers, sociologists, and Asian specialists; publications and manuscripts; research notes and data; bibliographic card files; and photographs and slides of her travels.

## BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Irene Barnes Taeuber was born on December 25, 1906, in Meadville, Missouri. She received degrees in sociology from the University of Missouri, A.B., 1927; Northwestern University, M.A., 1928; and University of Minnesota, Ph.D., 1931. In 1929, she married fellow student and demographer Conrad Taeuber, who went on to a career as an administrator, statistician, and demographer with the U.S. government. They had two sons, Richard and Karl, both of whom became demographers.

In 1936 Irene Taeuber began her lifelong affiliation with the Office of Population Research at Princeton University, while continuing to live in suburban Washington, D.C. From 1936 to 1954 she compiled, edited, and wrote articles for *Population Index*, a periodic bibliography of articles on population. From 1954 until her retirement in 1973 she pursued her research under the auspices of the Office of Population Research.

While Asia, especially China and Japan, was the focus of much of her interest and scholarly investigation, she also wrote about the population of the United States, Latin America, Africa, and Oceania. She wrote sixteen books and monographs and about 250 articles. She is best known for her monograph, *The Population of Japan* (1958). With her husband, she coauthored *The Changing Population of the United States* (1958) and *People of the United States in the Twentieth Century* (1971).

Irene Taeuber was a consultant on projects with the U.S. government and the United Nations. She was visiting professor at Johns Hopkins University and lectured at many universities, seminars, and conferences in the U.S. She was an active participant in numerous international population conferences, especially the congresses of the Pacific Science Association. She was the first woman to serve as president of the Population Association of America (1953-1954) and as vice-president of the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population (1961-1965).

When Irene B. Taeuber died on February 24, 1974, she was working on a major book on the population of China.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Because demography is a multi-disciplinary field, Irene Taeuber's papers will be of great interest not only to demographers, but also to sociologists, anthropologists, historians, statisticians, and scholars interested in population studies and fertility control. Taeuber based her research on comparative demography and modernization theory. Culturally and geographically she focused on eastern Asia—first Japan and then China. Her China project encompassed the population of the Chinese cultural area, in which she included not only China, but also Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Taiwan, Korea, and Japan.

The correspondence, records of her primary and secondary research, and the demographic data are rich sources of information on Taeuber's scholarly work on Asia, the United States, and other regions. Her research files also constitute a valuable collection of periodic literature on population and political, economic, and cultural topics concerning Japan, China, and other Asian countries.

The collection provides a picture of Taeuber as a pioneer in both defining the study of population within the larger field of sociology and establishing the position of the woman academician.

She explained the process of demographic transition to stability in Japan, China, and the Chinese cultural area and the problems connected with demographic transition in Java, Bangladesh, and India. Taeuber focused upon the demographic transformation occurring in China and outlined the reasons for declining fertility, relating social factors to demographic and economic change.
