Bradshaw, a professor in the Department of Political Science and later Dean of the School of Business and Public Administration at the University of Missouri, Columbia, Missouri.

#### BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

William Bradshaw was a member of the political science faculty at the University of Missouri for 34 years (1927-1961), and later Dean of the School of Business and Public Administration at the University from 1946-1961. Dean Bradshaw taught Missouri Government and Politics, conducted research, which focused particularly on local Missouri government. He also served on the Columbia City Council and as a delegate to the Convention that wrote the present Constitution of the College of Arts and Science, University of Missouri. Bradshaw died in 1964.

Doris Crump Bradshaw, wife of William Bradshaw, was active with the League of Women Voters, Regent of the John Corbin Chapter of the National Society, Daughters of the American Colonists (D.A.C.), and was the Membership Chair for the Friends of Arrow Rock. She died in 1994.

The **William Bradshaw** series consists of correspondence between William Bradshaw and his father during the First World War, and later from 1925-1963; Research material on political parties in Missouri, Maps, Gubernatorial and Presidential elections; County Clerk material; Correspondence with the Political Science Department; Inter-Department correspondence; Letters of Recommendation written to various schools and agencies by Bradshaw on behalf of former students; Discussions on courses in Political Science; Presentation of various papers; Correspondence with other universities, such as Stanford University, the University of Nebraska, Pennsylvania State College, the University of North Carolina, and others; Correspondence with other groups, organizations, and Missouri State Departments.
